The Hate Incident Task Force ("HITF") met throughout 2018 and 2019 to plan and execute a process for capturing a range of sentiments held by CBH partners. The HITF then organized the qualitative feedback gleaned and produced this report as a both document of the responses and as a learning tool to influence our recommendations to the CBH Board of Directors.

The conclusions from this exercise indicate that future improvements should be made in the following categories:

- Intentional transparency and timely communication
- Focus on representing the CBH community and then to the extended Jewish community
- Advanced planning for both general security and response to future incidents
- Requesting and receiving support from our extended community
- Internal and external educational programming on anti-Semitism and hate incidents

We accomplished a lot this past year but still have much to do. Plans are in place to continue campus improvements, further extend security, and make our already excellent education and entertainment programs even better. 2019/20 should be another great year!
