## **Looking Forward: Our Continued Needs**

As we developed the budget for the coming year, we faced both ongoing challenges and new opportunities that depend on your continued partnership. Several factors contribute to our increased financial needs:

**Infrastructure and Maintenance:** Our beautiful campus requires ongoing investment to remain safe, functional, and welcoming. Critical infrastructure improvements that have been deferred now need attention to preserve our facility for future generations.

**Inflationary Pressures:** Like many organizations, we continue to face significant increases in operational costs. Utilities, insurance, maintenance contracts, and other essential services have risen substantially, impacting our budget even as we maintain lean operations.

**Strengthening Our Operations:** Following the sudden passing of our Executive Director William Hines in December 2023, Wendy Haworth stepped forward from her role as Accounting Manager to serve as acting Executive Director. While we hired temporary help to assist Wendy, for over a year she has admirably handled both positions—an unsustainable workload that has placed tremendous stress on her.

The Board has now formally appointed Wendy as our permanent Executive Director in recognition of her dedication and excellent service. To properly support her and our congregation, we must hire a permanent Accounting Manager. This crucial position will provide the financial oversight and administrative consistency needed to ensure responsible stewardship of your contributions.

**Program Excellence:** We remain committed to offering the vibrant religious, educational, and cultural programming that enriches our community life, requiring continued investment in our clergy, educators, and staff.

## **Our Request**

Building on last year's generous response, we are asking each partner household to once again consider a sustaining pledge that reflects both our community's needs and your family's capacity for giving. Our suggested giving levels are:
